- Increase demand through Dairy Sector expansion
- Seasonality Issue
- Less Family Farm Labour
- Ageing Farmers
- Less New Entrants

SUPPLY IS LOW

- Pick up in economy
- Competition with other industries
- Availability of suitable people from EU declining
- Work permit issues (non-EEA)
- Student numbers decreasing in Ag Colleges
- Students attending Ag college for different reasons
- Full time work stability issue
- Lack of specific training on practical farm skills

Selection Process

- 3 to 12 months placement available peak demand Jan to June
- Full Time-placements also available.
- Candidates apply directly and shortlisted for interview
- Interview with FRS
- Second round interview with FRS
- Placement offer
- Candidates secure own flights
- FRS collect from Airport in Ireland
- Day 1 & 2 group induction, meeting managers and assigned farm
- Day 3 brought to farm and settled in
- FRS will inspect all accommodation in advance to ensure suitability. It will be provided on or near the farm.
- Pastoral care provided by local FRS Manager and staff throughout
